THE NATIONAL MUSEUM OF MARTIAL ARTS IS MARKING ITS 10TH ANNIVERSARY!

In honor of the anniversary, all visitors are offered a free visit from 10:00 to 23:00 hours during which they can watch a full day presentation of museum work at the Department of History of martial arts, visit the exhibition of museum martial art equipment, participate in many workshops, buy souvenirs in the gift shop, rest at the coffee shop and sign up for their first class of martial art of their choice.

Today brought a new freshness and liveliness to the premises of the Museum, said Arsenio Brewer, curator at the Department of History of martial arts, in an interview.

"Today is a wonderful day for us, it's our Museum's birthday. We opened the doors at 10 o'clock and it's a full house all the time which is actually the nicest thing to see. Somehow we hadn't expected such a big crowd considering it's a working day, this makes us very happy, and we expect even more people in the afternoon," Brewer pointed out.

"We have expert guides and documentaries that are constantly being projected. We also exhibited things that people cannot see every day, as a kind of workshop where they can learn something new. The program has been fulfilled until tonight. In the evening hours, we will have lectures from some of the most famous experts in this field. Michelle Yeoh, Jet Li, Chuck Norris, Jean Claude Van Damme and Takumi Hawking, kendo champion of 2020, are just some of the guests who will make their appearance tonight. I would also like to point out that afterward, anyone can sign up for martial art classes. We encourage people to train in martial arts because it is very good for their health. First-class is free," said Jane Florence, the museum director.

The National Museum was founded in Areb, on November 20, 2010. Our leader Maddox Quint started this project on March 26th, 2010, and after 8 months of careful planning and hard work our building was on its glorious feet! It was, and still is one of the most known and famous buildings of Nucleria!

The museum complex consists of four pavilions interconnected by an access terrace, and a botanical garden that occupies the central space. The gift shop, coffee shop and info desk are located in the first pavilion. The gentleman at the info desk directs visitors towards the entrance of the second pavilion, which showcases the exhibition of the martial art equipment. In the third pavilion, there are halls that are used for lectures, presentations and/or workshops.

The museum director, curators and other museum staff have their offices in the smallest, fourth pavilion. In the big garden outside, on sunny days, different workshop activities take place. Here the visitors can train judo, capoeira, karate, kendo and taekwondo or a mixture of those martial arts, all guided by the best coaches in the country. The designer of the entire complex and the main supervisor of the works was the architect Paul Mackintosh.
